A healthy lake protects your quality of life, tourism industry, and local economy.






One of the most irrational things we can do is pretend our lakes will take care of themselves.






LakeSmart Participation Over Time






LakeSmart Participation Over Time







Kezar Lake hasn't always been the serene, beautiful, clean lake that it is today.


